## What is Food \$en\$e?

Food \$en\$e of Tully began in April 2007 by St. Leo's Church Outreach in response to the closing of the area's only grocery store.

The program offers quality food at a low cost and has no age or income requirements. **Anyone** in Tully or the surrounding communities may participate.

For \$15.50, you can purchase a **"Food Unit"** of frozen meats, packaged foods, deli items and fresh produce. The retail value of the Food Unit is \$25-\$30. **"Specials"** are also offered each month and may be purchased without ordering a Food Unit.

If there is a meat item in the Food Unit that you do not like, we will trade it for ground turkey or ground beef. Brown rice can be exchanged for white rice, pasta or stuffing.

There is no obligation to buy a Food Unit or Specials every month. You may buy more than one Food Unit in a month. There are no membership dues. Only cash, money orders or food stamps are accepted. **No personal checks!**

Food \$en\$e of Tully is one of 37 such programs throughout 14 counties coordinated by the Food Bank of CNY in Syracuse. Founded in 1985, the Food Bank of CNY is a not-for-profit organization that offers food assistance programs in Central and Northern New York.

Since Food \$en\$e is a cooperative buying program, the greater the number of participants, the better the buying power of the Food Bank in creating each month's Food Unit and Specials.

The Food Bank provides helpful recipes using items in the monthly Food Unit to be included in every Food \$en\$e order.
