S. DOUGLAS WEHBE




Valedictorian


Julie plans on attending Binghamton University to major in Computer Science.



The roster for the 2014-2015 school year for the Tully FFA came out and we noticed there was a problem. We did not have many Junior High kids involved in the only FFA chapter in Onondaga County. These kids are our future and without having the involvement of the Junior High they would not know what Tully has to offer in the agricultural field. To fix this problem we needed to get the Junior High kids involved and what better way to do it than going to talk to the kids first hand. Wonderworks Field Trip

On May 8, 2015 the eighth graders visited the Wonderworks Museum at Destiny, USA for our second annual trip! It proved to be another successful excursion.

From the bubble laboratory to the hurricane shack, 4D theater to anti-gravity globe, all 83 students enjoyed every inch of the interactive, hands-on museum. Students were "shocked" by the Telsa Coil, which emits 100,000 volts of electricity to imitate the feel of lightning. They piloted the skies in a virtual Apache Helicopter, played various virtual sports, navigated the world using a giant Google Earth screen, and played simulated air hockey – that's right; there was no physical puck, just a computerized projection of one!

In one of the more popular exhibits, Mind Ball, students challenged each other. A headband with electrodes is used to determine which competitor can remain the most calm and relaxed. EEG Technology is "used as a training tool for cadets at the United States Military Academy at West Point. Officers are not only trained to be alert but also to control their thought process in order to remain calm in high-pressure situations" ("Wonderworks").




Area Resident Earns Commencement Medal

CLOSING REMARKS



First, thank you to all of you in the Tully community who voted on May 19th. Our school budget was approved, and three new school board members were elected. These new board members will each serve a three year term, beginning in July 2015. Our new board members are Carrie Edinger, Matt VanBeveren, and Ed Wortley II. Congratulations to each of them.

Second, thank you to the three school board members, who will be stepping down at the end of this school year, for your many years of service to the District. These three board members are Jan Kublick, Ken Steiger, and Dan Twentyman. Combined, these three board members have served on the board of education for a total of 42 years. Mr. Kublick has served for 18 years, Mr. Steiger and Mr. Twentyman have each served for 12 years. Each of these board members has volunteered countless hours, and has been a part of the leadership team that has guided our district through some incredibly difficult financial circumstances over the past seven years.

Third, as we look forward to the summer there are two big initiatives that we will be focused upon. The first initiative is a potential capital project, aimed at addressing some of our infrastructure needs. Specifically these are mostly needs related to our parking lots, roofs,

elementary school heating systems, and our elementary school bus garage. Over the course of this summer we will begin to work with an architectural firm to explore possible options. The second initiative is that we will be revising our teacher evaluation process (APPR). The challenge with this initiative is that we will not know any of the requirements or guidelines for making these revisions until after July 1st. Regardless of the condensed timeline, we will have something in place prior to the start of the 2015-16 school year.
