
(art, PE and music) were able to play for 45 minutes and win prizes that were supplied by the students who created the games.





World Champion Bicycle Stunt Rider Chris Poulos Visits Junior High

On June 15, 2015 world champion bicycle stunt rider and motivational speaker Chris Poulos performed stunts and shared motivational words of advice with Tully's 7th and 8th grade students. His program entitled "Get The Most From Your Teenage Years: A Formula For Extreme Success" was engaging, exciting, and insightful. The quick and frequent transitions between personal stories and eyepopping stunts were the perfect combination to keep students interested.

Chris, a Rhode Island native, was a successful student-athlete who, upon learning of his ADHD, used bicycle stunt riding as a creative and positive way to channel his energy. Chris competed in 413 competitions around the world, winning 85 times. Although Chris was a strong competitor, his passion was to share his story with others. His goal now is to help high schools, colleges, and businesses cultivate an environment that improves attitude, productivity, teamwork, and creative thinking. Chris presently performs at over 150 country-wide locations each year.

Some of the main topics of his presentation consisted of the following: making good choices, rising above negativity, standing up for what's right, being cau-

tious and kind on social media, and making friends who will later become an essential network of people. His messages were simple and memorable. One of the highlights of his performance was when he did a jump on his bicycle over Mrs. Newton, Mr. Russell, and Mr. Thomas! CLOSING REMARKS



The 2015-16 school year will bring some important changes to the Tully schools. First, based upon what we know right now, we will be welcoming a group of approximately 60 kindergarteners to our elementary school this fall. In the spring we were able to meet 50 of these new students during our annual kindergarten screenings, and typically we register a few additional kindergarteners in August. I know our kindergarten teachers are excited to welcome our new students, and it is probably safe to say that our new kindergarteners are extremely excited to be starting school.

Second, we have been busy this summer hiring a number of new employees. We are not completely done with the interviewing process, but at this time we do anticipate welcoming six new teachers to our faculty in the fall. Additionally, we will be welcoming a host of other new employees (teaching assistants, teacher aides, bus drivers, cleaners). It is always sad when people leave us, whether they are students who graduate or employees who move on to other endeavors; however, each ending is always a new beginning, and we look forward to welcoming all of our new students and new employees.

Third, our arrival and dismissal times will be slightly modified beginning in September, to allow for the addition of an activity period at the end of the school day. Our activity period will be held Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. We will have a normal bus run at the end of the school day, and a late bus run at the end of our activity period. Sports practices will begin immediately following activity period, with the exception of Tuesday's, when there will be no activity period and no late bus run. On Tuesday's sports practices will begin immediately following the end of the normal school day. Our activity period will be a time devoted to academic enrichment, extra academic support, co-curricular clubs, and a time for students involved with sports or theater to complete homework or to study. Our building principals will be sending a letter home outlining specific times for arrival and dismissal at each of the buildings. The shifts in time are not substantial, but it is worth noting that they are different from the past. Additionally, it is important to note that we will not be offering a 5:15pm late bus run.

Finally, I would like to point out that we are shifting the varsity soccer field so that it is closer to the parking lot adjacent to the JR/ SR HS. We are doing this for several reasons, foremost of which is that the new location should provide a better playing surface for our athletes.
