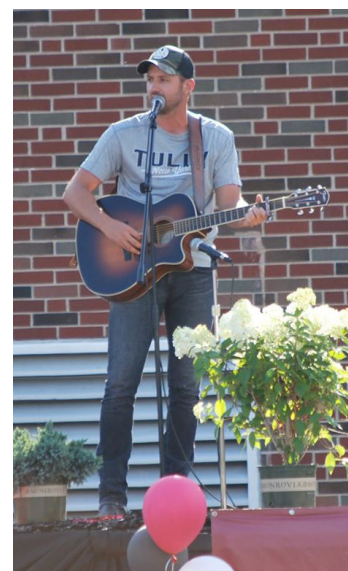




## 2020 Graduation Different but a Great Success

Second, thank you to all who cast an absentee ballot in this year's annual budget vote and school board election. The Tully

- ◆ HVAC units that service common areas in the JSHS will be replaced.
- ◆ The bleachers in the JSHS main gym will be replaced and the main gym will be repainted.

Finally, a word of thanks to all of our students, parents, faculty, and staff for their hard work during the pandemic related school closure this past spring. The transition from in-person schooling to virtual learning was sudden and challenging. During the three months our schools were closed, we collectively worked to develop and implement a Pre-K – 12 distance learning program. While this was certainly not an ideal situation, I am proud of the way the Tully School Community worked together to support our students.

## Food Bank of CNY Giveaway at Tully JSHS

Food banks all across NY have been doing milk, produce, and meat giveaways to those in need. Recently, Tully JSHS was a site for one of these giveaways, seeing approximately 600 cars. Cars began lining up at 11:00 a.m. even though the event didn't start until 3:00 p.m. By 4:15 p.m., only milk was left. Each car was given two gallons of milk, a 22-lb box of produce that consisted of potatoes, onions, apples, oranges, carrots, broccoli, and salad, among other items, and a 10-lb box of meat, which was diced chicken. Other sites in the immediate area were set up in Lafayette and Otisco. The giveaway was made available by the Food Bank of CNY. Tully Rotary and Tully Central School District administrators and staff volunteered to set up, distribute, and guide the traffic flow through the parking lot. Many thanks to those who volunteered and donated to make this event successful in helping to feed the community of Tully!

## Summer 2020 Pesticide Notice

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year. The Tully Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- anti-microbial products;
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- silica gel and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- the application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list. With the turn of events in the spring, Tully's transportation department took the task of delivering needed supplies and food to our students. There were many factors when deciding how to deliver but the primary focus was how to do it safely and efficiently. All contract drivers pitched in to help in the effort, proud of the job they do for the district. Mr. Bailey, bus dispatcher, believes that Tully has "a tremendous crew of friendly, conscientious, and safe drivers." When designing the routes to deliver meals and school work, they tried to match parts of the normal routes so the drivers were not only familiar with the route themselves, but so the drivers could potentially see their bus kids at some point. After each run, the buses were disinfected. The transportation department is now looking ahead to what summer and the reopening of school might look like. Whatever that may be, they are ready for the task that lies ahead!

## Tully's Food Service Helps Keep Students Fulfilled

Tully CSD has strived to keep education and mental health a priority during unsure times, but they have also fulfilled other needs such as delivering healthy meals to students who need them. Tully's food service team has prepared approximately 190 breakfasts and hot lunches to deliver each weekday. Mr. Kennedy, Tully's food service manager, says his staff is phenomenal, "They all wanted to continue working and were glad to still be able to feed the students." Some of the staff even got to make a few of the delivery runs and see the students. Mr. Kennedy explains that the change of process from feeding student in-house to at home was a substantial one, "We took the core of our operation and did a 180." With two days to coordinate transportation, plan meals, and let the community know about their endeavors, the food service team became an efficient "Tully Grubhub." The food service team worked closely with the transportation department, sharing a master delivery sheet to make sure all Tully students were taken care of. Tully is proud of their food service team, as they have worked so very hard to keep the students fulfilled!
