

SUBJECT: NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

No nonresident students will be permitted to attend Tully Central School District except the following:

- a) Children of a parent who is a permanent school district employee, but only for as long as the parent remains in the employ of the District, and only the children in grades Kindergarten – 12, or
- b) Children (and the full, half or step siblings actually residing in the same household), whose family has been residing on property out of the Tully School District and have been permitted to attend Tully Schools under the pre-existing “grandfathering” provision; i.e. only the families in those residences are permitted to have their children attend Tully Schools; or
- c) Children whose family moves out of the Tully school district may be permitted to complete the school year in which the family moves out of the school district provide proper conduct and attendance are maintained; or
- d) Children whose family moves out of the Tully school district during their junior year will be permitted to complete their senior year in the Tully School District provided proper conduct and attendance are maintained.

Nonresident students will not be provided any transportation by the Tully Central School District; the parents/guardians are fully responsible to get such students to the school building.

Further, students who are eligible to attend Tully pursuant to the criteria set forth above must annually apply to the Superintendent for permission to continue to attend Tully provided proper conduct and attendance are maintained.

No tuition shall be charged to any nonresident student who attends Tully in accordance with the criteria set forth above.

Notes

- a) A listing of families that reside on the “grandfathered properties” (as outlined in b above) is maintained in the Office of the District Clerk. No other nonresident students are eligible to enroll in Tully.
- b) If the family of a nonresident student moves from their then current residence, any family moving into such residence will not be permitted to attend Tully Central School District, but is eligible to attend the school district in which such residence is actually located.
- c) If questions exist with respect to residency, the school district may, at its option, require appropriate proof of residency by the parent or guardian.
