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From the Interim Superintendent



I would like to bring you up-to-date on some of the happenings across our campus this fall. We had a smooth opening and it was great to see everyone back and feel the excitement that surrounds a new school year. Please take the opportunity to enjoy the talents of our students as they participate in concerts, athletics, and extracurricular activities.

Board of Education: We welcomed three new BOE members to the governance team. All members are actively involved in the search for a permanent Superintendent and should have a selection

soon. This is one of the most important functions of a school board as their choice of Superintendent will affect the path of the District for years to come.

We will soon begin "budget season." The BOE sets the Budget Calendar in October and it marks the official start in the creation of a budget to put before the voters in May. This is very close to a year-long process as monitoring of the budget is ongoing.

The BOE members also work on various committees; Policy, Audit, DEI (Dignity, Equity, and Inclusion), Academic Advisory, Athletics, Facilities, Health & Safety, and Wellness. There are community representatives on the Audit, Facilities, DEI, and Health & Safety committees as well.

A very special "thank you" to all BOE members for their dedication to the students, staff, and Tully community. They are elected volunteers who give back to the school community by donating countless hours of their time to the betterment of Tully CSD.

Capital Project: We are wrapping up the majority of the current capital project. There is some work continuing on the JSHS auditorium and four classrooms at Tully Elementary. It is always a challenge to complete these projects on time as all districts need work done over the summer months and there are only so many contractors to go around. This year we also experienced some supply chain issues. With that being said, I think you will appreciate the final results.

I applaud your willingness to protect past investments in our campus as well as to look toward future needs. Maintaining a school district is a continuous process.

Academics: One of the most important jobs of an administrative team is to work with our professional educators to create a learning environment, which builds upon past success and looks forward as to how we can better educate our students.
