Application Date	April 3, 2026; rain date June 6, 2025
Application Location	Perimeter fence lines, building perimeters, all lawns excluding Elementary State Street side and excluding entrance to playground. (Note: Entire campus will be closed the weekend that follows treatment.)
Product to be Used	Triplet SF / LESCO Three-Way Selective Herbicide / NUTRITE
EPA Reg. No.	228-312 / 10404-43 / Prod. Code P004432

As a reminder, the following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- anti-microbial products;
- nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- the application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- the application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- the use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.
